## 2019 Public Policy Priority:

## **Accessible Parking**

Strengthen the enforcement and increase the availability of accessible parking spaces. Address placard fraud and abuse by revising criminal and civil penalties and improving public awareness. Develop innovative, collaborative solutions to adjust for the growing demand of accessible parking spaces as our population ages and more people acquire or are diagnosed with mobility disabilities.

## **TCDD Investments & Impact: Accessible Parking Awareness Campaign**

TCDD's recent project investments to build capacity to improve the system in Texas:

- Access Empowerment developed a comprehensive marketing strategy to educate the community about the importance of accessible parking and the impact to people with disabilities when people who do not need accessible parking use these spaces illegally.
- Travis County Constable Precinct 5 developed a multi-faceted accessible parking awareness
  campaign, Operation ACCESS, to educate the public about accessibility, decrease violations, and
  enable people with disabilities to actively participate in their community. Travis County planned
  to educate the public on accessible parking and universal design, design targeted educational
  outreach materials, and hold a community-wide symposium.
